## **PEACH PASS WARNS CUSTOMERS OF PROBABLE E-MAIL PHISHING SCAM**

ATLANTA—The State Road and Tollway Authority today is alerting Peach Pass customers about an e-mail and text message phishing scam being reported by customers in other areas of the country.

Some E-ZPass customers in Georgia and several other states, including Massachusetts, Ohio, New York, and New Jersey, have received fraudulent e-mails and/or texts from “E-ZPass Customer Service Center” with the subject, “Payment for driving on toll road” or from “E-ZPass Collection Agency” with the subject, “Indebted for driving toll road.”

Please be advised that if you receive either of these messages, they are NOT authorized communications from Peach Pass, E-ZPass or any other tolling agency. Instead, they are likely part a phishing scam. You are advised NOT to open or respond to either of these bogus messages. Immediately delete them from your inbox.
