PEACH PASS Now Operates in 18 States with Expanded E-ZPass Partnership

Customers can "keep moving" across toll roads in more states than ever before

with Peach Pass

ATLANTA, GA – The State Road and Tollway Authority (SRTA) announced today Peach Pass customers can now seamlessly access E-ZPass tolling facilities in 10 more states – increasing its interoperability to 18 states total. Last fall, six new states were added to the network through the E-ZPass partnership, in addition to the two states (Florida and North Carolina) where Peach Pass previously operated.

Now, existing and future customers can enjoy the ease and convenience of using their Peach Pass account and transponder to travel on E-ZPass toll roads throughout Florida, North Carolina, Indiana, Illinois, Kentucky, Maine, Maryland, Rhode Island, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Ohio, West Virginia, Virginia, Minnesota and Delaware. Peach Pass is also currently interoperable with Florida's SunPass, E-Pass and LeeWay, and North Carolina's QuickPass.

"As customers plan their business travel and road trip options in the new year, they will now have the convenience of using their Peach Pass transponder seamlessly to pay tolls in our partnering states," said Jannine Miller, Executive Director at SRTA. "This partnership helps us expand toll access for Peach Pass users in more states than ever before."

Both Peach Pass and E-ZPass operate through an electronic toll collection system, which automatically deducts payments from prepaid accounts as the customer drives on the toll lanes. New customers can open a Peach Pass account online or at the customer service center, as well as through BancPass with as little as \$20.

In addition to giving Peach Pass customers more flexibility, this partnership also allows

E-ZPass customers to use their transponder on Georgia's Express Lanes.
